

In efforts to assist those youth and young adults experiencing homelessness, Hale Kipa, Inc. has established the Transitional Living Program (TLP). TLP provides outreach and residential services to young adults ranging in age from 18 to 21 to promote their successful transition to self-sufficiency.

**Youth have the option to work with the staff on an outreach basis or within the more structured residential setting*

Transitional Living

The TLP residences house up to 4 each in two men's homes and up to 4 in the women's home, which includes pregnant and parenting young women. While in residence, the young adults work towards education and vocational goals and learn life skills to aid in their goal of self-sufficiency. It is our goal to provide a stimulating environment for young adults to transition off the street, or out of homelessness. It is our commitment to honor their strengths, illuminate their challenges, and support them in realizing their goals while providing appropriate structure and support.

Outreach Services

Outreach participants receive case management services as well as goal planning and skill learning. By working with young people on an outreach basis they can progress toward their goals at their own pace. Outreach enables TLP to meet young adults where they are at.

Admission Criteria

- Ages 18-21
- Street-identified, at-risk for homelessness, and/or homeless
- Willing to participate in program
- Desire to make changes to better one's situation
- No presenting condition not able to be managed at residence (e.g. psychiatric, active substance use)

Discharge Criteria

- Young adults turn 22 years old (a young adult may enter at the maximum age of 21 and age out at the age of 22 years and six months)
- Young adult successfully completes program goals
- Young adult voluntarily leaves program
- Young adult needs services beyond what the agency can provide
- Young adult is terminated from program for gross violation of rules
- Program loses contact with young adult; whereabouts unknown
